Except one small horse Colt which I give and bequeath unto Barry Stagner brother son of William Moway of Hopkinton Territory to him and his heirs forever. It is also my will that if any dispute should arise between my children about my Estate or about the execution of this my last Will and Testament, It is my will and desire that it be left to the determination of Justice Turner, and Thomas Stentry and their decision is finally settle the matter of dispute. I hereby nominate and appoint my friend Justice Stentry and myself Thomas Stagner sole executors of this my last Will and Testament.

I hereby revoke all former Will or Wills heretofore made by me and so declare this Will alone to be my true last Will and Testament.
