 one by paying Samuel Davis and John Davis their hundred dollars
 each and paying their sisters - I appoint James and James Davis
 Executors for the estate

 form to wit Whereas I the said Elizabeth M. Place deceased with
 John Wallace and having two lots of land one in Shelby the
 other in Adams Counties Kentucky with some other personal estate
 which I have given to me as my part of my father's land and
 estate and it is my will I desire that all of the above mentioned
 land or lots of land that come or may hereafter come by or
 through me or mine or any estate in and to my dear, beloved
 husband John Wallace in the same way as if it had come by
 himself - This is to say my will is that my personal estate to him
 and his heirs and assigns forever to hold and dispose of it as
 the same may be his own all being for the benefit of
 his children for himself and particularly for my dear, beloved
 little daughter Sarah Elizabeth Wallace -

I do hereby constitute and appoint my dear, beloved John Wallace
 my husband as my Executor to this my last will and Testament nothing
 and animating all other wills, writings and confirmations and no
 other to be my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and affixed my seal the day and year first above
 written signed sealed acknowledged and witnessed
