Morrison and Stephen Goggin in order to settle with them and being first sworn it appearing to us that the personal Estate and have after the widow received her dower fell to George D. Howard and Lemina his wife late Lemina Goggin also nee Miller and Caroline Matilda his wife late Maria and Stephen Barnett B. Howard and Sophia his wife late Sophia Goggin there being two more heirs of Stephen Goggin and William Goggin, which having agreed to take the landed part of the said Estate as their part of said Estate and the Administrators producing to us a refunding bond acknowledging a receipt in full of their party of said Administrators in the following words and figures - we jointly and severally depose ourselves or heirs to refund our respective proportions of any debt that may hereafter arise against the Estate of John Goggin due to his Administrators William H.
