 reduced in body though in my proper mind and reason of Thomas
 Moore do resign my body to my Mother Earth and my soul to the
 disposal of all mighty God and more so it respects my last testament
 and all my property of every description it is my last will and
 testament that Phoebe Moore my wife shall have the whole
 and sole interest little to do and respect of us she may think but
 while she may survive and when it is please God to call her
 her next of kin desire that what ever way she may think proper
 to dispose of the above named property should be duly

and solemnly attended to and stands good in law and now as before
 stated being in my proper reason and of my own free will have
 given to my loving wife all the above Effly this day and date above
 written so I ask no more of this courtly affair. Amos and in witness

Agreeable to an order of the Worshipful Court last Madison at their
 December Court 1818 appointing the undersigned Commissioners to
 sell to the Widow of Abram Rippert all her slaves in the land and
 negroes that at the house of Polly Rippert Sept 16th 1818
 and after being first sworn proceeded to lay off her right of dower in the
 tract of land which she now largely owns and owns as follows
 Beginning at a stake in the old stave in the road leading from Rich-
 mond to the mouth of Tally creek thence with the old line S 78° E 26
 poles crossing two branches to a sugar tree and hickory at thence S 33
 E 60 poles to the old corner thence with the old line S 48° E 50 poles to
 the corner at E thence with dotted line S 63° E crossing the road in all
 32 poles to a stone by a dead apple tree at N thence S 27° E 19 poles
 to a hickory tree at the springhouse at N thence North 35 E 16 poles to a
 stone by the said road at E thence with the road S 37° E 13 poles
 at N 61° E 16 poles to the Beginning containing thirty acres by survey
 and including the Madison House &c. We also proceed to lay off
 her right of dower in another tract of land where Sterling Johnson
 now lives by metes and bounds as follows to wit Beginning in the
 old line at 6 eight poles or more of the Beginning corner at E thence with
 the dotted line S 61° E 57 poles to a ash and sugar tree the old corner
 of the survey at E thence with the old line S 37° E 70 poles to a hickory
 on a branch at E thence with the same thence S 48° E 10 poles to an Elm and hickory
 the old corner at E thence with the old line S 78° E 26 poles to the Beginning
 containing thirty acres or more of land We also
