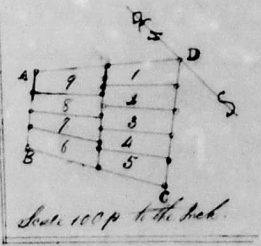


Moody and corner to the land of David Gordon thence with said

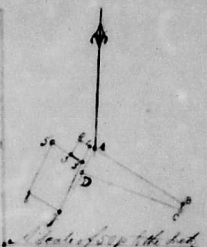
