my stock of every description ^{to wit} horses cattle hogs together
with all my farming utensils with all the household and kitchen
furniture until her death and if it should be the will of God I mean
to move off said Plantation I do hereby empower my executor
to assign, sell, lease, or convey, or bargain, or sell, or convey
strenuously, or household, or kitchen furniture as he, my wife Frances
shall think best either at public or private sale if it should be
his free choice so to do but the price to be in her hands, it is my
will and desire that at the will of my wife Frances my daughter
Jane Mary receive the lawful use of ten dollars, that I give
and bequeath to her husband her Mary, to my daughter Mary
Mary I give and bequeath ten dollars to my son Andrew do I mean
I give and bequeath one hundred dollars to my son John Marion
I give and bequeath three hundred dollars the balance of
what I owned equally between my daughters, Elizabeth & Frances
I hereby ordain and appoint my wife Frances Marion and
James Nichols Executors to this my last will and Testament
In testimony whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th
day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and twenty

give to her for her part of the negroes during her life, as
soon as they shall be sold, and her children - The other two negroes to be
held out for the use of the children to be born the thing of my
land to my wife during her life the other two things for the use of my
children and as my wife is now pregnant of that child she
live to have a proportionable part with the rest, my wife to be 10 p
and over give her for another year to support her and her child
my crop tobacco, hogs to be sold to pay debts after they are paid
for the use of my children My two daughters, Elizabeth Mary &
Betsey Hays to have a bed, a piece, and furniture, the rest of the
furniture for my wife I appoint John Bennett and Sa-
muel Hays my Executors or either of them, to this my last
will and Testament to be witnessed by at least two persons to be
hand and affixed (my seal this 21st of September 1820
