 sound mind and memory I do hereby make and
 give as follows my last will & testament
 I will give and bequeath my said to give to give
 them of and my body to the earth from whence I may
 taken for security hereinafter.

And as much as I have heretofore given to my daughter
 James Robertson and negro by the name of Breman
 and Thomas Robertson and negro by the name of Peter
 and to my daughter Elizabeth Hurma and negro by the
 name of Charles and to my daughter, Land Hurma
 and negro by the name of Prudence I consider
 that I have given them their full part & portion of
 my estate

It is my will and desire that should my negro woman
 shall be free at my death to set and go for herself
 according to her own pleasure forever and beget
 to my dear Sarah and Cotton spinning wheel and all
 her goods to be her property forever

I give and bequeath to my daughter a negro woman to my
 daughter Patience Jolly & her heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my daughter Phoebe Bailey & her
 heirs a negroman by the name of David

I give and bequeath to my son Benj. Robertson and
 his heirs forever and negro man by the name of Bill

It is my will and desire that my house furniture
 be sold and my just debts paid with the proceeds
 and any thing remaining over and above that the same
 be equally divided between my daughter Patience
 and my son Benj. Robertson and Phoebe Bailey and my son

It is my last will and testament that should my within
 mentioned children and their heirs shall peacefully possess
 and enjoy the within bequeathed property forever
 Having given and bequeathed my whole estate to my children
 and in the manner and as forms within mentioned I
 have nominated constituted and appointed my daughter
 Patience Jolly my true and lawful executor to my
 my last will and testament whereunto I do my
 hand and affix my seal this 12th day of January 1823
