In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one
 I Charles Roberts of Madison County and State of Kentucky being afflicted
 with a disease of body but possessed of a sound mind and memory
 but knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I wish therefore
 to dispose of my worldly estate in the following manner to wit First of
 all I wish all my just debts paid Secondly my last will that my beloved
 wife (Molly) have all the negroes that belong to me at this time and their
 increase together with all my land whether papered and all my farming tools
 for her own use until all my children shall have arrived to the age of
 twenty one year old - Also I give unto my wife and her heirs all one
 year old last spring - Thirdly I do bequeath my daughter Nancy fifty
 dollars to be paid out of my estate in due following of the way best and
 Fourthly I will unto my wife the sum of fifty dollars paid in the
 same like manner - Fifthly I do bequeath my son John the sum of
 fifty dollars paid in the same manner - Sixthly I will unto my son
 Rudolph fifty dollars to be paid in the same manner - Seventhly my
 wife and her heirs should my wife - Lastly I do bequeath all my children
 shall arrive to the age of twenty one year old to them and in that case I
 wish all my estate both real and personal to be sold and the proceeds
 monthly until it is to be equally divided between all my children
 and again my wife is that she should my wife and her
 my youngest children should have arrived to the age of twenty one
 year then my wife is that all my estate then remaining I do bequeath
 unto a twelve month credit and equally divided between all
 my children, excepting one third part of my land including the
 dwelling house and my negro women and all her increase
 then I will to my my wife - Lastly during her natural life, and
 after her death to be sold and equally divided between all my
