The instrument of Writing to wit the will of Samuel Jones deceased was produced in open Court and proven to be the last Will and Testament of Samuel Jones Deed by the oath of William Williams and Mary Jones both subscribing Witnesses made and sworn to be received and the same has been done according to that David Harris Clerk.

In the name of God Amen I John Cockran being in perfect health and of sound mind and memory And calling to mind that it is ordained for all men who to die I do assign my spirit unto God who gave it and my body unto him and nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection God will raise this body and reunite it unto the soul by his almighty power - And my lastly Substantive Witness that it has pleased God to

bestow on me I do bequeath in the following manner unto my son Samuel Cockran I do bequeath and leave unto him all that piece of land lying on the East side of Silver Creek corner to William Cockran running 185 poles to Wm Cockrans Corner thence with Thomas Barles land 101 poles thence with Robert Cockrans

land to Silver Creek and up said Creek with its meanders to the Beginning as is marked upon plat - that and no more 2^d unto my son Robert Cockran I do bequeath his homestead and thirty six and a half acres of land lying on the East side of Silver Creek and bounded as follows beginning on said creek at a Buckeye and Walnut corner to Samuel Cockrans 242 poles thence 14 poles to a Buckeye corner to Barles thence with Barles line 111 poles to a stake of Hay fork thence 153 poles to a stake to the intersection of Cockrans old line with the Western Marions thence 18 poles to a double oak thence 153 poles to Silver Creek thence up said creek with the meanders 115 poles to the Beginning.

Thirdly I do bequeath unto my son John Cockran all my lands & tenements on the West side of Silver Creek after the decease of myself and my wife Mary Cockran also one black Horse saddle and Bridle.

also one brown steer also one Bae and Fur miter Fourthly I do bequeath unto my son William Cockran on or about the 1st day of November also five hundred dollars to be paid if convenient before my decease if not he paid after my decease out of my goods.

Chattles I also order that my negro woman Mary and her son John free to be sold after me and my wife's decease.

And this I do ordain to be last Will & Testament respecting all former Wills and I do appoint my son Samuel & Robert Cockran my executors unto this my last Will In Witness whereof I have hereunto set down my hand & seal this 21st day of October 1817 and 11th Year of American Independence.
