It is my Will and desire that all my just debts be punctually paid and faithfully discharged fully above and bequeath to my dear beloved wife Sarah the full use and exclusive privilege of me and furniture therein belonging to be disposed of at her discretion, and also she is to enjoy and enjoy one equal third of all my property hereditamentally and appurtenances of all debts due and owing to the last before mentioned excepted, during her natural life and after her death to be disposed of by her heirs (mentioned) fully as for the heirs of my son James Barry decd. and Deborah Barry decd. having heretofore given their property to the amount of their share, that they shall only receive the sum of one dollar each to be paid by my executor hereafter named when called upon, and as for my daughter Sally Todd wife of John Todd, I having given her the Dower her share in my only given her one dollar to be paid by my executor when called upon, and as for

the balance of my Estate it is to be equally divided between my son John Barry and my daughter Lucy Anderson, after Joseph Anderson the said Lucy's husband, shall receive fifty dollars, it being the one half share (money paid to John Todd, and also the one third left to my wife Sarah aforesaid) is also to be equally divided between my son John and my daughter Lucy aforesaid. My son John Barry has fully received property to the amount of fifty two and a half dollars which is to be considered as so much of his part paid him, and accounted for in his settlement with his sister Lucy aforesaid, I have named and appointed my dear beloved wife Sarah my executrix and Joseph Anderson my son in law executor to this my last Will and Testament Given under my hand and seal this 30th day of February 1820
