I John Mungy of the County of Glamorgan and State of Northwales being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and memory and understanding considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of time thereof and being desirous to settle my mortal affairs and thereby to be better prepared to leave this world when so shall please God to call me hence do hereby make and publish this my last will and Testament in and unto my lawful friends hereby making full and valid all written and printed this date bearing my name to be my last will and Testament thus -

First and principally I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my wife and family and after settle my last acts as follows I have and do hereby give and bequeath as follows -

Item It is my will and desire that all my personal and real estate remain in the hands of my beloved wife Polly Mungy during the time of her widowhood in order to assist her in raising and clothing (maintaining and) Educating my children -

Item It is my desire that if my wife Polly Mungy should enter into marriage after my decease that she shall have only one third of my estate both personal and real during her natural life the other two thirds of my personal and real estate to be taken into the hands of my executor, hereinafter named and to be equally divided among all my children when they become of legal age -

Item At the death of my beloved wife Polly Mungy her share of my estate both personal and real to be equally divided among my children there and share alike what ever the reason may be whether my wife Polly Mungy has been married after my decease or not -

Item It is my will and desire if my wife marry after my decease that my executor hereinafter named should divide both my real and personal estate into three equal parts and give my wife one share or third to possess during her natural life and at her decease be equally divided among my children there and share alike -

And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my trusty friends and

neighbor James Harrison and Joseph Miller to be my sole Executors of my last will and Testament. In last my having these witnesses set my hand and affixed my seal the 3rd day of May in the year of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ one hundred and twenty two John Mungy

being dead and declared by John Mungy the above named testator and for his last will and Testament in the presence of us who at his request in his presence and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses thereto

last will and testament in the manner and form following to wit
1st After my decease I wish my executors hereafter to be named to pay
all my just debts and Funeral Expenses—

2nd I give and bequeath to my daughter Isabella Taylor one thousand
dollars in common current money of Kentucky—

3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Fanny Bartleson one
thousand dollars in common current money of Kentucky—

4th It is my will and desire that whereas my brother James Bogie
and myself are in partnership in the great saw and horse mills
that he should have one third part of the profits and interest of
said Mills according to a specific bond of mine held by said
James Bogie and it is to be understood that this clause of
my will is only to seeme to have the same immediate and
privilege that the said bond was intended to do and no more
It is further to be understood that the said James Bogie is to
have one third part of the Expenses of all necessary repairs of
the said mills with the said saw and horse mills with his compliance
with the above provisions and also provided that he nor his
heirs shall never sell the above interest in said mills to any
person or persons except to my sons James Bogie & Andrew
