

Pursuant to an order of the County Court of Madison made at their February term 1820 to us and also to divide the land between a half of Thomas Mally deceased, a quarter of the same of said Dec^d Mally, we being first sworn do report as follows: First we met on the land and examined it together with Richard Funston the said Thomas Mally's surveyor's report. There is 108 3/4 acres of land which is the remainder after the widow Drucilla Mally's part was allotted to her. We do divide it in two parts and allot the first part which contains fifty three acres to the said Dec^d Brother's and sister's which is named in the said will which of Bonnard as follows: Beginning at the corner of the fence and Sugar tree at the end of the lane and by a creek road thence with the meander of road S 67° N 1/2 pole thence S 57° N 3/4 pole thence South 7° N 25 pole to a white oak stump near the fork of the road thence with said road S 7° N 30 pole to a stake corner to Benjamin Morton thence with his line North 81° E 15 pole to a stake thence North 15° West 10 pole to a small walnut and elm thence North 77° E 27 pole to a walnut and oak stake corner to said Morton and Joshua Linn thence with his line East 13 pole to a hickory stump corner to said Linn thence with his line North 100 pole to a stake on the north waddy line near a branch thence South 58° West 88 pole to the Beginning. The second part containing fifty and three fourth acres which we do allot to the said Dec^d first wife's sister which is named in said will which is Bonnard as follows: Beginning at a stake in a field corner to Joshua Linn thence with his line North 88° East 29 pole to a small walnut standing on the bank of a branch thence down the branch with its meander South 75° E 59 pole thence South 77° East 25 pole to the mouth of said branch thence down said branch with its meander North 32° East 14 pole to the intersection of John Gaff's line thence with his line West 110 pole to his corner a Lynn also corner to Drucilla Mally thence with his line South 58° West 88 pole to a stake near a branch corner to said Dec^d Brother's and sister's which we have allotted to them thence South 33 pole to the Beginning.

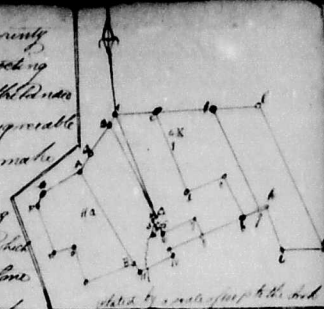

In pursuance to an order of the Madison County Court made at their April term 1820 directing us the undersigned Commissioners to divide the land Estate of Joseph Holt's between his heirs agreeable to said Dec^d Mally after being first sworn do make the following report: First

We allot to Joseph Holt 56 1/4 acres including his dwelling house designated by a letter B and is bounded as follows: Beginning at a stone in the great road leading from Joseph Holt's to paint lick and by a creek road thence with the meander of road S 67° N 1/2 pole to a stake corner to B thence with his line North 7° N 25 pole to a white oak stump near the fork of the road thence with said road S 7° N 30 pole to a stake corner to Benjamin Morton thence with his line North 81° E 15 pole to a stake thence North 15° West 10 pole to a small walnut and elm thence North 77° E 27 pole to a walnut and oak stake corner to said Morton and Joshua Linn thence with his line East 13 pole to a hickory stump corner to said Linn thence with his line North 100 pole to a stake on the north waddy line near a branch thence South 58° West 88 pole to the Beginning. executors thereafter hereafter appointed in this my last will. Secondly my will
and desire is that my my dear Christopher, Isaac and to hold all my real estate
both real and personal during his natural life then upon the decease of my said
my said will and desire is that my Estate be divided as followeth. First
I desire and bequeath to my son Lewis Christopher a negro fellow called by
the name of Lewis also a negro woman by the name of Sarah and her
child called Linney to the said Lewis Christopher and his heirs forever
I do likewise give unto my son John Christopher a negro fellow called a negro
known by the name of John. I also give and bequeath unto my son
Ambrose Christopher a negro woman by the name of Sarah, and all the
land whereon I now live to him the said Ambrose Christopher and
his heirs forever. I do also give unto my daughter Rachel Butler a negro
fellow called and known by the name of Jeff Throat and also a negro girl by
the name of Bess also I give unto my daughter Rachel Henry a negro
fellow by the name of John. I also give and bequeath to my three
Daughters Polly Charity Blue Kimball and Rachel Henry all my personal
estate to be sold and equally divided between them to them and their heirs
forever. I do hereby certify and appoint Ambrose Christopher and
Thomas Butler Executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness
