 First it is my will and desire that all my Best debts be paid them. It is my will and desire that the Executors herein after appointed and whenever they conceive it expedient within one year after my death cause all my personal property to be sold at Public auction and the proceeds thereof equally divided between my eight children viz John, James, Susan, Pr and William Boggs, Boggs, Jordan, Tyne, Putney and Isaac Boggs or their legal representatives. Item It is my will and desire that my Executors whenever they conceive it expedient within one year after my death cause my negroes (except Hannah and Henry Benton) to be sold to the highest bidder amongst my children above named and the proceeds thereof equally divided between them or their legal representatives. It shall be the duty of said Executors to give previous notice of such sale to each of said children &c. Item It is my will and desire that my friend James Anderson Esq. within one year after my death survey and divide the tract of land on which I live into eight parcels which he will divide to equal value and set on file in the direction and impartiality of my said friend for this result. And I hereby will and bequeath unto each of my children herein before mentioned one of said parcels to be ascertained by lot by said Anderson, a plan and map of which as soon as I can will be made out by said Anderson distinguishing the acres of each parcel and returned to the County Court of Madison and entered of record as an appendix to this Will.
 Item I will and bequeath unto Susan and Elizabeth my best child of my daughter Polly to be divided to the sum of hundred and fifty dollars each and out of this sum I leave them to be clothed and educated by my Executors and whenever they may practically arrived at the age of fifteen the balance of any remainder of this legacy I leave shall be paid to them.
 Item I will and bequeath unto my daughter Isaac Boggs my negro boy named Henry Benton to her and her heirs forever and I hereby appoint my Executors herein after appointed Guardians for said Isaac until he is of age and I leave them to support and educate him out of the annual proceeds of his estate.
 Item It is my will and desire that my Executors as soon as they can

22 my negro woman slave Hannah at my death. And when to the County Court of Madison require bond and security of my Executors to prevent her from becoming chargeable to the said County. I reserve it as a duty of my Executors to give such bond.
