The undersigned having been appointed by the Madison County Court
 at their January Term in the year 1824 for the purpose of taking
 and taking the estate of John Peck and his wife and that he
 proceeded on the 2^d day of January last to discharge his duty
 but on account of illness and being from John Peck and
 family the brother of said deceased he was unable to get
 the possession of any of the property for some time but that
 finally he succeeded in obtaining the possession of two
 negroes which are as follows Daphny, Selby, Mary, Sarah
 & Hannah all of which are negroes who were of legal age
 given him & Daphny young negroes were born on the 2^d
 about 7 or 8 years old and two infant children of the
 negro woman Hannah the undersigned was compelled
 to agree to pay or to see paid John Peck for his wife's share
 her two children the youngest of which is to him to be

her was but seven years old whatever should be right he was obliged
 to pay I made bills in collecting since my own not being able to get
 them ahead until he was not known at the time the precise amount
 of them not having paid them. He was unable to hire any of the
 negroes to such persons as he has consigned in & thought it
 improper to hire them publicly as he believed and attempted
 would be made by some person employed by John Peck to
 run them off as he attempted to do to him the undersigned was
 endeavoring to get the possession of them he then proceeded to his
 duty to place them at such places as he thought proper for them
 he was without any expense which he accordingly was the
 undersigned has not been able to get any other property of any
 description whatever but believes that said Peck has the share
 of one or two loads some small articles of household furniture
 & a few loads of cattle which he believes is now in the possession
 of John Peck but which is claimed by said Peck
