 I have in my possession four negroes belonging to said John Turner decd. two of them are women and about 20 the other between 20 & 23 years old the other two are children under 10 years old one of the women I lived out the first of January last for 12 months for sum of \$4. The other I lived at the same time for 12 months for the sum of \$12 there came into my house five negroes belonging to said John Turner decd. but one of them a child under 10 years old has departed this life since said negroes came into my possession. This is a true statement of the situation of the estate of said John Turner decd. which is respectfully submitted to the consideration of the Honorable County Court of Harrison County under my hand this 7th day of April 1823.
