

In the name of God. Amen I Susannah Johnson of the County of Madison and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament. In the first place resigning my body to the Mother of God, and my soul to God who gave it. In the second place after all my debts and funeral expenses are paid the residue of my Estate to be disposed of as is hereinafter directed. First I give and bequeath to my beloved Husband Jesse Johnson my riding mare, one roan horse and one black horse, one bed bedstead and furniture first choice also the residue of my house hold and kitchen furniture excepting what is herein after directed. I also give and bequeath to my said husband all the farming utensils whatever they may be. I also give and bequeath to my said Husband four shares of Bank stock which I hold in the Capital stock of the bank of Kentucky. I also give and bequeath to my said Husband for the term of fifteen years my negro man Vincent also three negro children, a girl by the name of Nancy seven years old the twenty fourth of February last also a boy by the name of Telford five years old the twenty third of July next also a negro girl by the name of Rebecca four years old the twentieth of June next the said boy Vincent is not to be removed out of the County aforesaid of Madison and it is intended for the special use of my said husband and in case he or my said husband should remove out of said County of Madison my Executor hereinafter appointed is to hire him out and the proceeds arising therefrom to be paid to him my said husband or his legal Representatives by my said Executor to be applied in any manner he may think proper. The aforesaid two negro girls and boy are to be free at the age of twenty one years and to remain in the aforesaid County of Madison during the aforesaid term of time and to remain in the possession of my said Husband until they become of age or in the possession of his legal representatives and at the age aforesaid they are hereby declared free by this my last Will and Testament but in case my said Husband should remove out of the aforesaid County of Madison or die then in that case my Executor hereinafter appointed is to take them into

possession and send them out to such trades as he may think most advisable until they become of age at which time they are hereby declared free from servitude to act for themselves and after the aforesaid term of fifteen years my said Negro man Vincent is to serve my said husband agreeable to the before mentioned provisions he is to be free by this my last device, and is hereby declared free from servitude to act for himself. Secondly it is my Will and desire that my negro woman Calista the Mother of the above named three children shall be set free at my death and by this my last device she is hereby declared free from servitude to act for herself from and after the aforesaid time but it is my desire she should stay with her children although this perfectly at liberty to do so or not. It is further my Will and desire that my negro boy Brandol aged eleven years old the third day of January last shall be free at the age of twenty one years old and by this my last device he is hereby declared free from servitude at that age and to act for himself but my Executor hereinafter named is to take possession of him at my death and to bind him out to such trade as he may think most advisable as soon as he may think proper until he shall become of age at what time he is declared free. I further give and bequeath to Sterling Johnson one hundred and fifty dollars out of my stock I hold in the Bank of Kentucky to him and his heirs forever likewise one trunk and one pillow blanket. I further give and bequeath to my brother Isaac Lewis three shares of Bank stock which I hold in the bank of Kentucky to him and his heirs forever. I also give and bequeath to my niece Susannah Pindley wife of Richard Pindley six shares of Bank stock which I hold in the bank of Kentucky to her use and to be disposed of in any manner she may think proper. I also give and bequeath to my niece Susannah Ellis wife ofaddy Ellis and Daughter of my Brother Joseph Lewis three shares of Bank stock which I hold in the bank of Kentucky to her use and to be disposed of in any manner she may think proper. I further desire and desire should be sold and equally divided two shares of Bank stock which I hold in the bank of Kentucky between my Brother Isaac and his two daughters Nancy and Polly Lewis and between Samuels his two daughters Nancy and Rebecca Nichols and Abby Pitty and Polly Johnson daughters of my said Husband Jesse Johnson. I further desire to give to my Brother Brandol one black gelding nine years old one black gelding seven years old one whip also one drift white pained green spotted the balance of my

negro woman Betitia all my coarse clothing also one covered
green bodice one lincey blanket also two home made dresses out of
which she will take choice of the coarsest, also one piece of ^{cray} homspun
linen about twenty yards also one trunk To Brandol one covered bodice
one lincey blanket one dress to make him clothing out of Toanny
Lucas one yellow changeable linen two dresses to make her clothing out of one
changeable silk dress To Susanmah Finley one black lincey with
dress To Mary Finley one slope lacomet dress To Sally Burm one
top blue ground dress white slope and one red silk shade striped
the balance of my caps and handkerchiefs to be equally divided between
my two sisters Isaac Lewis' wife ^{Finney} and James Lewis' wife Sally
To Vincent my blue man one bodice cover lid black the balance
of my clothing including stockings &c to be equally divided between
Isaac Lewis' four daughters and James Lewis' four daughters and
Anny Little and hissey Pickersly I also devise to Susanmah Finley
my riding dress saddle and blanket the balance of my estate what
ever it may be the proceeds of which I give and bequeath to my
sister Martha Cook if alive and if not alive to be equally divided
between seven of her children by the following ^{names} James Cook Joseph
Cook John Cook Brister Cook Mary Cook who intermarried
with a Mr Brister, Sally Cook who married a Mr Lee but it
is to be understood in this my last device to my sister Martha
if alive if not to her seven children before named there is in the
afore said County Madison a tract of land which I hold it is
my desire should be sold by my Executor hereinafter named
for the best price, and in such way as he may think advisable
for the benefit of the before named devices and who is hereby vested
with full power to do so and convey the same and the proceeds aris-
ing from said sale to be paid to my before mentioned sister Martha
if alive if not alive to be equally divided between her before
mentioned seven children If the land will not sell it is to be divi-
ded among them accordingly in case my said sister is dead to
this my last will and testament I do hereby appoint The Executors
of Richmond by my sole Executor to this my last will and testament
hereby revoking all former wills by me made In witness whereof
