 I mean real and personal -

My will and desire is that my Executors make

 as they shall think necessary for my wife to keep
 her and raise my children. My wish and
 desire is that my Wagon & Team be left with my
 son Henry after being first mentioned in order
 to help my wife raise my children and when
 my Executors shall think fit then sell said
 Wagon and Team and not until then.

In fact I wish it remembered that my Executors
 shall have collected all debts due me and pay all my
 debts & do every thing just and right agreeable to the
 above request of mine. Lastly I do hereby appoint my

 hoping they will carry this my last will into effect.

On the name of God Amen, I John Stewart of the County of Monmouth and State of Kentucky being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and of sound memory and understanding considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of time thereof and being desirous to settle my mortal affairs and thereby to the better prepared to leave this world when so shall please God to call me hence do hereby make and publish this my last will and Testament in the presence of my fellow citizens hereby making and a voice all written as following this date knowing my way to be my last will and Testament thus -

First and principally I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my wife and family and after all my last acts are done I have and bequeath as following - Item - It is my will and desire that all my personal and real Estate remain in the hands of my beloved wife Polly Murray during the time of her widowhood in order to assist her in raising & clothing & maintaining and educating my children - Item - It is my desire that if my wife Polly Murray should enter into marriage after my decease that she shall have only one third of my Estate both personal and real during her natural life the other two thirds of my personal and real Estate to be taken into the hands of my Executors hereinafter named and to be equally divided among all my children when they become of legal age Item - At the death of beloved wife Polly Murray her real Estate both personal and real to be equally divided among my children there and there alike what ever the reason may be whether my wife Polly Murray has been married after my decease or not Item - It is my will and desire if my wife marry after my decease that my Executors hereinafter named should both my real and personal Estate into three equal parts and give my wife one share or third to possess during her natural life and at her death be equally divided among all my children there and there alike - And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my trusty friends and
