This statement of Orsoper to Lewis, A Married Widow
and sister of William Sumner Lee was returned

In the name of God Amen I James Stone of the
County of Jefferson being now a free state of body
Next but in a state of mind suited to a
repetition of my words as such and
publish this as my last will and Testament

as follows First my Will not devise is that after my
last will in print that the residue of my estate real
and personal mixed in paper and receipt or
remainder be equally divided between my six
children first Robert S Howe (deceased) D Howe
Lally Ann Howe Mary Jane Howe Robert S Howe
and Catharine Howe to them & their heirs forever.

The above named Executors to be paid out to the
respective legacies at such time or times as a
majority of the Guardians hereafter named for
said Children shall deem it advisable & pursuant
that they should respectfully have the same.
And my desire that William Howe Samuel Stone &
John Devereux be and I hereby appoint them &
the survivor or survivors of them joint Guardians
to my before named six Children (whose all)
infants of tender years And I rest them with
full power to manage my estate as I myself
could do according to their joint discretion
or the direction of a majority of them. They
are empowered to see that the property of my
property and at such times as they may think

reasonable and best way for or all of my Estate, interests
property or business as they may deem proper, as well as your
and his sole order when there is a difference in opinion among
them the opinion of a majority is to be binding. And in
case of a difference of opinion among said Guardians
on any matter of importance it is my desire that either
William Williams should be consulted and that his
opinion in such cases should have equal weight with the
one of said Guardians. And I would recommend
said Guardians in all cases when convenient to
consult my brothers Caleb Stone and Thomas Mc Stone for
each of whom I have great respect. If it should so
happen that when both William Williams and Caleb
Stone should be an equal division among said
Guardians and thus then I wish either Caleb Stone or
Thomas Mc Stone to act so as to form a decision.

It is my wish that said Guardians above named should
as early as practicable procure a book in which a
record of the description and amount of my Estate
shall be kept and of the ^{annual} ~~yearly~~ profits and
expences or disbursements and that they from
time to time furnish Col. William Williams with
a copy of said register or account - It is my wish
that Samuel Stone take and receive my son Col. Stone
and my daughter Catherine Stone and use them
and exercise such authority over them as he would
over his own - It is in like manner my wish that John
Turner take and raise my two daughters Julia Ann Stone
and Mary Jane Stone and receive the same power and
authority as above spoken of -

I also request that my brother William Bone to take and
arise in like manner my daughter Charlotte Bone
and son Robert B. Bone -

To my brother Thomas H. Stone I should be very anxious
himself in such ways as for it to be convenient for
him to do so I would him from that time to take my
above named son Robert H. Stone and raise him -

It is my Wish that all my Children be instructed and that
the Expense of Education rather than of carrying to them
out of the Joint Fund - The Laws and property be kept
or in partnership between me and them and that I
should remain under his management and
partnership so long as he may think proper to use the same
provided it be not longer than till the Succession may come
