I John Thompson of Madison County State of Kentucky being of sound health and sound mind but accounting my years having no children of my own have thought the Will of God what I should do at my death and I have thought my wife then and after our death the estate that belongs to me after paying my legal debts and last rights the property coming my lands that I have my own and also the property then left. I have legally divided between Priscilla H. Swinney my wife and my children Priscilla Childers. Her daughter's children and the heirs of her land I have given to P. H. Swinney my wife's son which is one half of the tract I have here and I give him a little land to make him a whole but have concluded for Priscilla H. Swinney to come in for one half by this my last will and testament and cause the bond to be made for one half of the land to be of no effect but to cause an other made for the whole tract and within the money which I have here for satisfying a three paid in Kentucky the balance in one and two aparts. And divide the amount of what the said land would bring between Priscilla Childers and Priscilla Childers being the legal father of them by name John W. Bush Sally Bush and Priscilla Bush and Priscilla H. Swinney their mother. But Priscilla H. Swinney must have four hundred dollars more in the sale of the land than a mother must have after in equal division and among them and where the said land is sold John W. Bush must have his part in their hands and let him pay for the land and mortgage for him. The money must also be divided among them except P. H. Swinney must have two more money than the children. And for the balance to be equally divided between P. H. Swinney John W. Bush Sally Bush and Priscilla Childers whole stock I have here and divided equally the money and equally among them all. Priscilla H. Swinney and John W. Bush are to be as administrators by last will of John Thompson but none of it to be active on till the death of the said John Thompson and Sarah Thompson his wife. And if the children of John Thompson die before any property should sell and the money come into their hands P. H. Swinney have the whole and P. H. Swinney and his children should die the estate should go to John Thompson's heirs John Thompson

against Andrew Thompson younger and William Thompson younger.
