In the Name of God Amen I Bazel Pinckston of Madison County Kentucky in health of body and of perfect mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows: that is to say, I give to my wife Bazel Pinckston all my Estate Real and Personal consisting of Land Negroes and Stocks and household furniture of every kind to be by her disposed and enjoyed as her own property during her natural life. ~
 Secondly I give and bequeath to my Negro Woman and her children and enjoyment of her Liberty as wife and woman at the death of my wife under the Guardianship of my Sons Bazel Pinckston and Thomas Pinckston whom I hereby constitute and appoint my Legat Guardians of the said Negro woman and of her two Sons Equiano and Bob and Abiah Ann and the aforesaid Executors they or any of them 1838 at which time the said Equiano and Bob shall be free to all intents purposes and enjoy all the privileges of free men of Color and I hereby authorize the said Bazel and Bazel L. Pinckston and Thomas Pinckston to have the said Boys to work for slaves as they may in this Engagement think they will be well used until the aforesaid year 1838 and the aforesaid Sister Ann shall serve until the year of our Lord May the 15th day Eighteen hundred and forty four at which time the aforesaid Negro girl shall be free to all intents and purposes and all the Children the aforesaid Sister Ann shall have if any shall be free at the same time &c &c and if the aforesaid Negro Ann should have any more Children before her freedom

They shall if males be four at the age of Twenty five
and if females be four at the age of Twenty One, and
I hereby place them under the Guardianship of the
said John and Bazel Lee Pinkston and Thomas Boyton
to be disposed of in the same manner as in the Case
of Squire and Robt. That is to be understood that the
Legatee that is Convinced is to have the refusal of the
hire of all the negroes and it is hereby to be understood
that none of the negroes is to be taken out of the State, and
Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my son Bazel Lee
Pinkston after the death of my wife the whole of my
tract of Land wherein I now live (contain seventy seven
acres) on Condition that if he will pay Six hundred Dol-
lars Current Money of Kentucky for the same in two
years after the death of my wife but if he refuses this
Condition the Land shall be sold or divided in the manner
Fourthly I give and bequeath to my Children (viz) Elizabeth
Diana Emilia Pate Lee, Bazel Pinkston, Rebecca Sharp, Mary
Proctor, Elias Pinkston, John Pinkston, Malinda Thedder,
Polly Hagner and Bazel Lee Pinkston all of my whole real
and personal that is to say the full proceeds of the hire
of the negroes the Price of the Land and the Sale of all the
stock lamp household and Kitchen furniture. &c.
Lastly I hereby appoint Bazel John Pinkston, Bazel
Lee Pinkston and Thomas Boyton the Executors of my last
Will and Testament whereby revoking all other Wills by
me made in which when of I have made said my
hand and Seal this the 1st day of August in the 1821
