I do hereby certify with an order of the Madison County Court at their
Sesory Term 23rd appointing William Malt, William Miller & John
Duncan or any two of them Commissioners to settle with the
administrators of John Davidson and his said and son having
been the Guardians to Joseph Kincaid Junr who was son of Joseph
Kincaid now deceased who the undersigned being first sworn
have proceeded to execute the same and report as follows. We do
not find that any estate belonging to the said Joseph Kincaid Junr
ever came into the hands of the said John Davidson as Guardian for
said Joseph but one tract of land containing 50 acres for the end of this
land from the year 1816 to 1825 inclusive the Guardians received the
sum of \$161.58

One third of this sum appears to be coming to Mr
Davidson formerly Mr Kincaid & Mr Miller said Joseph
with Richard said John Davidson & John Malt for
his own or said lands 80.79
Leaving John said Joseph Kincaid Junr the sum of \$80.79
We find that the said John Davidson as Guardian
received of the said Joseph or said account 62.83
Leaving a balance due said Joseph by his
Guardian of \$18.75

Let there be made no charge against the said Joseph for his father's
raising, nor against him any credit for his labor on the farm with
his Guardian who have made no calculation of interest on the money
received by the Guardians for rent nor allowed him any thing
for the value of farming & collecting evidence that there is coming

have been my share had they been living after her death to be divided among
named my children as follows William Jacob, Mary, Polly, John,
James, Thomas, Vincent, Rebecca, Elizabeth, Sally, Patsy, Louisa, Kelly,
Susan, and Nathan. Lastly my desire is that the part of my estate
which I shall be necessary to my wife shall be paid to her and that she
not go to the benefit of her husband but shall be exclusively for the
benefit of the heirs of her own body and this 23rd day of March
and in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred twenty seven.
