 Christ, my body I leave to be buried at the discretion of my executors,
 hereafter all my debts lawfully contracted I desire my first honestly
 paid and what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with
 I desire to dispose of as follows I Infirmus I give and bequeath all
 my Estate to my wife Lucy to have and to hold for ever and at her
 death she may do as she thinks fit with the perishable part of
 my Estate, but my Land at her death I give and bequeath unto
 my son James M. Smith and his heirs for ever. Also at my death I
 give and bequeath unto my son James M. Smith, the benefit of
 that debt that I paid William Wells Administrator to Henry Wells
 died of five hundred and twenty four and twenty one that was due from
 John Smith to Henry Wells, deceased and the balance of John
 Smith's Estate if any to be appropriated to the benefit of his Executors
 this I give as my last will and testament this 25 day of October 1824
 given and my hand and seal this same 25 of October 1824
