Shallly I wish each of my children when the majority arrives at the age of 21 years to have a hundred dollars given them and each and charged with the bond at 6% banked I wish each of my sons as they arrive to the age of twenty one year shall have a portion of my estate not to exceed one thousand dollars each to be charged with their names heretofore I wish each of my daughters to have the same amount as they arrive to the age of twenty one or should they marry charging them with the amount they receive - I wish my Executors at any time that any of the negroes I may have may become ungovernable or unprofitable to the estate to sell any part of them at any time either privately or at public sale I wish my Executors to receive and from the Sheriff a tract of land I purchased at Sheriff sale in kind Point and have sold the same to John White I wish and hereby authorize my Executors on receiving title from the Sheriff to deliver the same to said John White on his paying the purchase money. As a witness that any of my sons after they arrive at the age of twenty one year my wish to go to the expense and sell many of my lands in that State I wish them to have it at their choice. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this first day of September in the year 1832 and one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven
