Agreed to under order of the Madison County Court to be recorded in the
undesignated Commission who being first sworn and go on the ground on the
day of December 1837 and did proceed to lay off and set to Elizabeth
Hapgood and child of Samuel Hapgood their down in the State
of land as follows Beginning at a wash and sugar tree thence S
13 E 32 poles to a white limestone sugar tree thence S 78 E 17 poles to a
stake and two sugar trees marked as points thence N 32 E 23 poles to a sugar tree
thence N 72 E 7 poles to the beginning. Designated by the figure 3 thence N 17 E 5
poles to a stake thence N 69 E 4 poles to a stake thence S 10 E 28 poles to a stake
stake and a ash thence N 88 E 22 poles running through the middle of the Barn
to a sugar tree thence S 1 E 20 poles to a sugar tree and thence S 89 E 24 poles
to the beginning. Designated by the word line and 100 and ending 142 acres
including the Madison House Kitchen Spring and half the Barn and the greater part
of the apple orchard. All this said proceeds to divide the balance of the tract of
land between the legal heirs of Nathaniel Amory the upper lot N 1 Containing
19 1/2 acres the same to William Smith the lower lot N 2 Containing 25 1/2 acres
