A. Elder
Will

In the name of God Amen. I, Andrew Elder of the County of Madison and State of Kentucky being duly thought the abundant mercy of God for a benevolent, merciful and understanding Deity and ordain this my last will and testament and give it that it be deemed valid and binding all that I have said I will positively under my estate and am content to be disposed of in the way and manner following.

First, that all my just debts and general expenses be paid out of my personal estate. (Secondly - I do bequeath unto Jacobson Elder, a plantation on the river, called of Silver Creek containing about sixty and twenty acres adjoining William Corington and James Vonder weathers reserve that David Elder his father shall have the management of the same for the support of his family during his life. Thirdly - I do bequeath unto Jackson Elder son of David Elder the 100 acres of land which my mother known to be got by, Elkinsons parents. Fourthly - I do bequeath unto Nancy and to my Elder daughter of David Elder two Chival out of my stock of cattle. Fifthly - I do bequeath unto my son, James Elder, all the balance of my estate both real and personal. Also do nominate and appoint David Moberly my executor. Sixthly - That the said Moberly is to take good care of my mother and to support her mother decently during her life.
