Marble table, Maps & Carpets, clock & shall be divided by
my five eldest children as my other house and furniture &
each child shall move his or her part out of the house and
affix the plantation not to return again and so kept separate
and a part within twelve months after my death, otherwise
such portion shall be sold in the Richmond Seminary tract
as the property of that Seminary. Green Blay.

My looking glass, my Picture and my wife's shall remain in the
house, the others may remain or not as my five eldest
children may choose. My Piano in the parlour may be
taken by my daughter Sally Ann Irvine at a fair valuation
in the division of the house and furniture may be directed
But if she refuse to take it in that way then and in that
case I give it to my grand daughter Sally Blay daughter
of my son Sidney B. Blay. But he shall move home within
one year after my death otherwise I give it to the trustees
of the Richmond Academy (Madison County Ky.) & their
successors for the time being for the use of said Seminary or
academy as the law terms it, this addition to my will made
wholly by. Green Blay.

My sons Brutus and Joseph shall have no part of the
profits of the Estate given them by my will until they arrive
to the age of twenty one years, that shall be supported, James
Joseph in school & board & need full clothing out of the
profits in the hands of my Executors, and the profits of their
Estate until they arrive of full age shall be a profit in the hands
of my Executors. Green Blay.
