At a County Court held for Madison County on Monday the 1st day of January 1827. This Inventory and appraisement of the estate of John Gallows but did was returned and ordered to be recorded and the same has been done accordingly. Attest David Erwin Ck

In the name of God amen I Robert Donch of the County of Madison and State of Kentucky being what in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory helped be attorney at law for the said John do make and publish this my last Will and testament in manner and form following that is to say first I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife the plantation or which I now live with all the appurtenances thereto belonging to have and hold and peacefully to enjoy during her life time the land and farming utensils together with the house held and to be known as such after the death of my said wife to be sold and equally divided amongst my children my son Eliza Donch and William and Thomas and my two daughters Elizabeth Ramey and Polly Ramey all of the above named children having had to the amount of fifty dollars of my estate, the residue of my child run mind Edward Saml Robert and John being infant children I hereby declare and direct that the last named children shall have each of them to the amount of fifty dollars, to make them equal with the first named children thus the balance of my estate to be equally divided amongst all of my children that is after my lawful debts are paid, I hereby appoint my wife executrix my son Eliza William and Thomas executors to this my last Will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of June in the year of our Lord 1821.
