disposing (Mind) that I do hereby do ordain, constitute  
and make this my last Will and Testament hereby giving  
all others by me made heretofore (made)  
Then I do by my Will and devise that my personal estate  
Jem and Milson be sold and the proceeds applied in paying  
off my just debts, the balance of my negroes I wish my wife  
to have during her lifetime or till her death which ever may  
first happen.  
The Plantation on which I now live and my separate  
tract at some time sold, whenever my Executors may think  
proper for the best possible price the proceeds arising there-  
from to be in lands or where more suitable for my wife  
and the raising my children which I wish my wife to have  
the exclusive right and possession of during her life or  
till her death which ever may first happen. In case my  
wife should marry so in my Will and devise in that case  
that she gets her one third part of my estate in conformity to  
the law on that subject regulating Wills, it is my desire  
that my children be educated.  
Lastly I constitute and appoint my wife Edith Drutson  
and John White Esq<sup>r</sup> my Executrix and Executor to  
this my last Will and Testament as Witness my hand  
and Seal this 23<sup>d</sup> day of January 1829. in Drutson
