Report of Jacob H. H. Guardian for the heirs of John
Thompson deceased made to the honorable County Court of Madison
City Madison Kentucky for August 6th 1827 as follows -
That said Jacob came to my hands as Guardian for said heirs
at said date in the hands of the deceased John Thompson a County
Witness. My charge for boarding making washing
feeding and clothing said heirs was charged each \$45
per year - \$75

That I have been employed in the quarter
to sell the furniture to John H. H. for which I paid them
\$3. That for one work hat of Jacob H. H. 75 cents and paid
William H. H. \$1.12 for pair of shoes last fall also paid
William H. H. and John H. H. pair of shoes each paid 75 cents per
pair. That I have for said heirs furnished by me the articles for
