 I wish it is my will and desire that at my death my body
 be decently buried and any expense thereof be paid by my
 executor hereafter named.
 And I will and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Cynthia

170. I the said my last will and testament and twenty four dollars to be her and
 her heirs and assigns forever.
 And I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Mary Davis
 one fourth her bed and two dollars and one eighth part of my bed furniture
 and twenty five dollars to be paid to her and her heirs and assigns forever
 And I will and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Catharine Davis
 one fourth her bed and the other half of my bed furniture and twenty five
 dollars to her and her heirs and assigns forever. Also my third and fourth
 of my said daughter Catharine at my death shall have my family
 table to be her forever. I will and bequeath unto my daughter
 Sarah Phelps my negro woman Sophia to be a servant to her
 and her during life, but she is not to be sold of her without it be by her
 for her own benefit during her natural life but she may make
 such disposal of my said negro Sophia and her increase as she
 shall see fit by selling them to whomsoever she may choose which
 devised shall be good and valid as my said daughter Sarah death
 also I further will and bequeath unto my said daughter Sarah Phelps
 my Bureau and all the rest of my household furniture that may
 be at my death to her and her heirs forever.

And it is my further will and desire that after my death if any
 should be due, together with my burial's expenses but said all the
 balance of my estate shall be equally divided between my three
 children David, George Shurtz (Molly Truman) Sarah Phelps after
 first allowing my Executors hereafter named to make thereof
 to be theirs and their heirs forever. I do further nominate Executors
 and of some James Anderson & Henry Anderson my Executors
 of this my last will and testament. In Witness Whereof I have
