I then the 2^d my Will and desire is that my brother William Thomas shall have one half of the money arising from the sale of my share of the land on which my mother now resides — also my bed and bedding and my trunks — I then the third my Will and desire is that my sister Mary Thomas shall have all my wearing clothes I then the 4th my Will and desire is that my brother Samuel Thomas shall have all my tools and labor hired —

I then the 5th my Will and desire is that all other property which I possess shall be Equally divided among between all my brothers and Sisters (ent) William Skinner Garret and Thomas my brothers and Jane Nancy Betty Eliza and Mary my Sisters — I then the 6th my Will and desire is that my mother Sarah Ann Thomas and my brother William Thomas be my Executors under this my last Will and Testament signed and sealed in presence of the undersigned witnesses this 2^d day of March in the year of our Lord 1826
