 Loudoun and State of Virginia being in my sound mind and
 enjoying full health of body do make this my last will and
 testament, I will and bequeath to my sister Lettice Daugherty
 all my part of the land on which we now live including
 that part which I purchased of Stephen Gossens making about
 one hundred and thirty two and 3/4 acres, I also will and bequeath
 to my said sister Lettice Daugherty all my part to a tract of
 750 acres lying on the waters of Runnity creek in Loudoun
 Co. Ky. my part being two hundred and fifty acres, I also
 will and bequeath to my said sister Lettice Daugherty five
 negro slaves to wit, Mitt, Sydney, William, Hannah and
 Caroline, and I also will and bequeath to my said sister
 Lettice Daugherty all my Chattel Personal of every kind
 whatsoever now and to the same which we now possess in
 common the said negroes to sell to me from the Estate
 of my father Thomas Daugherty Dec^r 1825 simple do
 and I will and bequeath the same to my sister Lettice
 Daugherty as above during her life and at her death to do
 what she pleases with said land negroes and with the
 following exceptions (viz) I should my sister Patsy Gossens

have any living children I wish my sister Lettice good time to time
 to make them some presents say at stated years of age and at twenty
 One year of age as follows at sixteen years of age \$200.00 then
 at one or more children they are to have my two hundred and
 fifty acres of land and Runnity creek named above, and at twenty
 One years of age they are to have half of the negroes I do bequeath
 of said land. My sister Patsy Gossens should be left a
 widow and as that I have no living children I will and
 bequeath to her my said land on Runnity creek and half
 of the negroes, I now possess, and to my brother in law
 Stephen Gossens I grant full free acquittance for all the money
 he has lent of me and also above I wish the said Lettice and Patsy
 of land I bought of said Gossens here with the land being said
 Gossens part of the homestead of two hundred acres, which said
 Stephen Gossens was very considerable, provided the said Gossens
 make to my sister Lettice when called on a due and
 simple to his part of the homestead being half her and 3/4 acres for
 which I have no male or female obligation and provided also
 he give up to my sister Lettice a daughter my negro boy William
 now in his possession upon my said sister or her agent offering
 him her note for two hundred and seventy five dollars payable
 as per article in two years at being in part for the said Gossens
 part of the trade we now live on, but in case the said Gossens
 should refuse to make a due to my sister as above or refuse
 to give up the boy William as above, or should go to law
 endeavouring to break this will hereby in that case or either of
 them, I wish to my sister Lettice Daugherty all my land negroes
 I should and money in the hands of Stephen Gossens to have
 the same forever, I do testify and certify of I do make and my
 name and seal this 21st day of Nov^r 1825 Nancy Daugherty
