hereafter all my debts lawfully Contracted I leave my first honestly
paid and what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with
I leave to dispose of as follows I give and bequeath all
my Estate to my wife Lucy to have and to hold for ever and at her
death she may do as she thinks fit with the perishable part of
my Estate, but my Land at her death I give and bequeath unto
my son Samuel Smith and his heirs for ever. Also at my death I
give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Smith, the benefit of
that Debt that Spauld William Wells Administrator to Henry Wells
deceased of Two thousand two hundred and thirty seven Dollars that was due from
John Smith senior to Henry Wells deceased and the balance of John
Smith's Estate if any to be appropriated to the benefit of his Executors
this I give as my last will and Testament this 25 day of October 1824
