this as my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others.
I give my Will and desire is that after my death my just debts
any and funeral expenses be first paid out of the proceeds of my estate
Consisting of the profits of my Downy in the land and share of my late husband
John R. A. de. Second my Will and desire is that as my late son Thomas
R. A. de. by one misfortune or other has been made almost to ruin and
want that he the said Thomas have the balance of my estate
after paying as above which estate consists in the principal
upon my late son Thomas R. A. de. for the hire of my negroes and land
some of which are now in my possession and one in the pos-
session of my son John R. A. de. In fine, I Will and bequeath
unto my late son Thomas R. A. de. all the estate of which I am
seignior and possessed or entitled to as profits of my Downy estate
or otherwise absolutely intitled to in my own right reserving
my original Downy estate to be disposed of as the law directs
I bring only my wish to Will and bequeath such part
of the profits of said estate as may be left at my death
after paying for my support and maintenance out of the same
and such other estate I may be intitled to in my own right. Lastly I
appoint my late son Thomas R. A. de. executor to this my last Will and
