

16th I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Broadus
a negro boy named Samuels to be to his use forever
11th I give to my daughter Patey Broadus a negro woman
(named Christian) and all her increase that she may
have after my death or after the marriage of my said
Daughter Patey to be to her use forever

12th I will that after the death of my wife Mary
Broadus that all my Land (negroes and property of
every description then remaining and not otherwise disposed
of) shall be sold by my Executors on such a Credit as they
may think proper and all the money arising from the
sale of said estate except the money allotted to my son
Andrew shall be equally divided amongst all my children
heretofore named except my Daughter Catharine Price.

The Cause that governs me in not giving my daughter
Catharine more of my estate is because she has got the
two negroes and their increase which I gave to my son William
Broadus and believing that said negroes ought to have
been returned to me after the death of my son William, I
therefore conceive she ought to be satisfied and is more
than rich as of my two children will get to their share
and further I will that when Death has or may
take away any of my Daughters that their offspring
shall receive their part of their Mother's dividend &
Sister's share my son John Broadus, Ruben Monday and
Thomas Broadus to manage the money left my son Andrew.
And lastly I appoint my son John Broadus and
Thomas Broadus and Ruben Monday my Sole Executors
of this my last Will and Testament ratifying and confirming
this to be my last Will and Testament hereby nothing and
disannulling all and every thing heretofore made by me
in this behalf. I have hereunto set my hand and

and Testament as following (to wit). My Will and desire is
that my whole estate both real and personal be equally

Susan D. Taylor with the following conditions. If my
wife should marry and have a child or children the whole of
her part of my estate is to go to her child or children forever
But if she should never marry my Daughter is to have her
part of my estate after the death of my said wife, and if
my wife should marry and have no child or children my
daughter is in like manner to have my wife's part of my
estate and if my said daughter should die before she mar-
ries or is of lawful age to dispose of property her part
of my estate is to go to my wife and descend to her child or
children as before directed but if my wife and daughter
should both die before my wife marries and has a child or
children or my Daughter marries or is of age to dispose of
property, then in that case all the estate that came by
my wife is to go to her Brothers and Sisters, and the balance
to my brother and Sisters. I do hereby appoint my
brother in Law Walter Schinault Guardian for my said
Daughter Susan D. Taylor. And lastly I do hereby
constitute and appoint my friend and neighbour Robert
D. Harris and my brother in Law William Schinault my true

In the Name of God Amen I Bazel Pinckston of Madison County Kentucky in health of body and of perfect mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows: that is to say, I give to my wife Bazel Pinckston all my Estate Real and Personal consisting of Land Negroes and Stocks and household furniture of every kind to be by her disposed and enjoyed as her own property during her natural life. ~
 Secondly I give and bequeath to my Negro Woman and her children and enjoyment of her Liberty as wife and woman at the death of my wife under the Guardianship of my Sons Bazel Pinckston and Thomas Pinckston whom I hereby constitute and appoint my Legat Guardians of the said Negro woman and of her two Sons Equiano and Bob and Abiah Ann and the aforesaid Executors they or any of them 1838 at which time the said Equiano and Bob shall be free to all intents purposes and enjoy all the privileges of free men of Color and I hereby authorize the said Bazel and Bazel L. Pinckston and Thomas Pinckston to have the said Boys to work for slaves as they may in this Engagement think they will be well used until the aforesaid year 1838 and the aforesaid Sister Ann shall serve until the year of our Lord May the 15th day Eighteen hundred and forty four at which time the aforesaid Negro girl shall be free to all intents and purposes and all the Children the aforesaid Sister Ann shall have if any shall be free at the same time 1844 and if the aforesaid Negro Ann should have any more Children before her freedom
