 undersigned Commissioners who being first sworn and go on the ground on the
 day of December 1837 and did proceed to lay off and set out to Elizabeth
 May, widow and next of kin of Samuel Mayo dec'd. their down in the State
 of Kent as follows: Beginning at a wash and sugar tree thence S
 13 E 32 poles to a white limestone sugar tree thence S 74 E 17 poles to a
 stake and two sugar trees marked as points thence N 32 W 23 poles to a sugar tree
 thence N 17 E 7 poles to the beginning. Designated by the figure 3 thence N 17 E 5
 poles to a stake thence N 69 E 4 poles to a stake thence S 10 E 28 poles to a
 stake and a ash thence N 88 W 22 poles running through the middle of the Barn
 to a sugar tree thence S 1 E 20 poles to a sugar tree and thence S 89 W 24 poles
 to the beginning. Designated by the word line and 100 and ending 142 acres
