

I have given a negro Girl by the name of Maria with some other property which I do not intend to be considered as forming an part of her legacy I therefore consider her as ~~not~~ having received any thing only what she has merited by extra services rendered to me & family So my son Jacob & White I have gave to the amount of two hundred dollars So my son Daniel White I have gave a negro Boy by the name of Levi & other property to the amount of six hundred dollars So my son Richard White I have gave a negro Boy by the name of Enoch & other property to the amount of five hundred dollars So my son John White I have given no real property I therefore consider him as having received nothing. My desire therefore is that those of my children who have received as Express above the largest portions of my Estate shall not receive any thing more until they have not received so much as make equal with them And if any part of my Estate shall then remain my wish then is that it shall be equally divided among them and Lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my son Jacob & White & my son in law Silas Wright my Executors of this my last will & testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 2^d day of February in the year of our Lord 1835

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Smith of Madison County and State of Kentucky Being well stricken in years and weak in body Out of proper mind & much on thoughts calling to mind the Mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say I promise and give of all I give my soul to God who gave it and my body to the Earth to be buried as a Christian in decent like manner to the direction of my dear In witness to is my wife and I are in the said place and my last will and testament charges to be paid and satisfied And I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Smith all the benefits of the plantation I own live and have her share of three negroes one of the negroes I own and possess of also as many horses Cows Hogs & Sheep as she the said Sarah Smith my beloved wife may think proper to take and our half of the horses held and appraised furniture all of said property to be hers during her natural life and widowhood and at her death or marriage to be equally divided amongst my children David my son John Smith Mary Logan my daughter Jane Smith my son William Smith my son Elizabeth Smith my daughter and her heirs forever except Sarah Logan all the property devised her to in this my last will and testament to be only for her own proper use during her natural life and thus to succeed to the heirs of her body forever and when the final distribution of my Estate shall take place I give and bequeath to my son William Smith one hundred dollars extra more than the rest of my children it being in consequence of his being a cripple in one of his ankles - And to it my wife and I are in the above named children as directed in this my last will & testament the property I have given of to my children David to John Smith my son one negro boy named Philip valued to \$500 to James Smith my son one negro boy named Jerry valued to \$500 to my son William Smith one negro boy named Abel valued to \$400 to my son Will Smith two negro boys named Ruben & Lavin valued to \$400 to my daughter Elizabeth Smith one negro Girl named Charity valued to \$250 to my daughter my daughter and negro Girl named Rachel valued to \$550 the above property given of to my children shall count so much in their several parts when the final distribution of my Estate shall take place and the said children shall be paid with
