In the name of God amen I William Hubbard of the County of Madison & State of Kentucky Calling to mind the shortness of life and the certainty of death do make this my last Will & Testament bearing all former Wills Annul & form following (To wit) In the first place I will and bequeath all my estate both personal and real (except one hundred dollars to my beloved brother Moses Hubbard for and during the space of thirteen years commencing from the date of this Will and that an Inventory be made by two disinterested men of my personal property the men to be selected by my brother Moses and he shall have the use and care of all for the time above specified and further that my Will that my brother Moses Hubbard be appointed executor of this my last Will - Item I will and direct that at the expiration of the thirteen years from this date that my executor deliver my estate both personal and real to my two children Richard David & Sabrina and to be equally divided between them if both alive at that time but if either of be dead the survivor to have all but if both be dead and without issue then all this my estate will be divided equally between my brothers and sisters & their heirs by my executor - Item I will and direct that William Bridwell have one hundred dollars out of my estate at my death paid to him by my executor - Given under my hand and seal this 30th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven William Hubbard (C)

Jacob H. H. came to my hands as Guardian for said heirs
at said date in the hands of the deceased being in Madison County
Missouri. My charge for boarding making washing
feeding and clothing for said heirs children each \$405
per year - \$75

Since the death of my wife in June
I shall this summer be gone away for which I paid them
\$3.00 for one week's board of Jacob H. H. and paid
William H. H. \$112 for pair of shoes last fall also paid
William and John one pair of shoes each paid 75 cents per
pair shoes for said year furnished by my the articles for
