 of death do make and ordain this my last will and Testament hereby making
 and discharging a former one by me made
 In the first place I do hereby give to my daughter Theresa Selkirk
 my negro girl Lucy on her usual clothing with a blue and white calico
 and my pony horse which she now is the holder of and my and horse and
 and a black which is due to be divided in two of the equal portion of my estate
 which I shall hereafter give to her -- I do and bequeath to my
 said daughter Theresa three of my negro mares heres of my horses and one and
 bedding with a black which is due to be divided in two of the equal
 portion of my estate which I shall hereafter direct her to --

I do and bequeath to my wife Fanny Selkirk during her natural life
 the plantation with the appurtenances thereto which she now holds and which I now reside
 except what is called the Dee place which I now shall be divided and
 every year by my Executors hereafter to be named for the benefit of my estate I
 also leave unto her during her life three of my negro mares and two mares and
 each after my wife Fanny has made her choice and also my household and
 kitchen furniture. I do further my will that my Executors hereafter to be
 named at my death shall to my wife such a quantity of my stock of horses
 cattle sheep hogs as of my property as she may think fit to take and
 to carry on the farm together with the appurtenances of my home the upper
 and lower the family and she can raise a crop. I do my will that my son
Edmund reside on the plantation with his mother and assist in taking care of
 and supporting the same such terms as they may agree upon. I do also my
 will that my daughter Theresa Selkirk reside with her mother free of
 expense so long as she wishes. I do further my will and desire that
 at my death all my real and personal except what is herefore
 bequeathed to be divided in two manner as my Executors hereafter named may
 think best and the proceeds of said estate be divided among my children
 into three equal shares. I do my daughter Fanny and her children
 one share being one sixth of my estate. I do my daughter Fanny and her
 share being one sixth part of my estate. I do also my will and desire that
John Selkirk and William Selkirk my deceased husband's heirs be to my share one half
 of the Madison place in Madison County State of Kentucky as it appears by the papers
