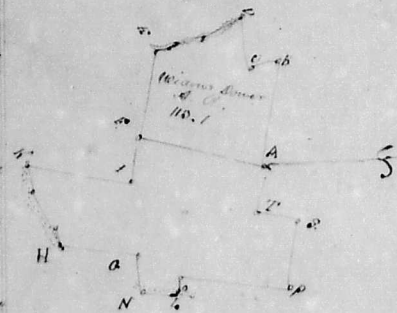

In the name of God Amen I, Alexander Burnett of the County of Madison and State of Kentucky being in sound mind and memory do make and constitute this to be my last will and Testament In the first place my will and desire is that my last debts be paid by my Executors hereafter named by making such arrangements as they feel to be best for the said debts to my wife & children Secondly my will and desire is that my beloved wife Betsey Burnett shall have the whole of my estate both real and personal during her widowhood, to enable her to rear and maintain our children and school them during which time she is to be under the direction and control of my Executors who are to guard the interests of my estate so far as there shall be no necessary private commitments And it is further my will and desire that should any of our children during my beloved wife's widowhood marry before to the age of twenty one years and incline to leave her that they so doing shall have such a proportion of my estate in advance as she and my Executors may find convenient to give and they my heirs and come within the limits of their several assignments of my estate and to take their receipt for the same as much as they have received in advance And it is further my will and desire that if my wife Betsey as aforesaid should marry again so that she is to have and enjoy the one third of my estate during her natural life (and at her death the said and agree that may be allotted her to succeed equally to our children then as now have or may have at my death and to their heirs forever And I do nominate and appoint Robert A. Morale & John Anderson to be Executors of this my last will and Testament In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of December 1824 signed sealed & attested in presence of
