Amen, I Francis McDougal of Kentucky State in County of Mason State of Kentucky at the weak in Body yet in full exercise of my Reason do hereby make this my last Will & Testament. It is my will and Order that all my last debts be paid out of my Estate, Likewise that Susannah the Black Woman thought of John Hunt the 23 of May 1809. Shall be free & the Descendents Likewise free and bequeath to the said Susannah all my Estate both real and personal to have it at her disposal at my Death, Given under my hand and seal This thirteenth day of May 1810

In obedience to an order of the Court of the County of Marion to us directed from their June Term One thousand Eight hundred and nine the Subscribers met at the home of M^r. Patsy Sandridge of same County on the day and date hereafter written and thereupon at the Special Instance and request of M^r. Patsy Sandridge the Widow of the said James Sandridge deceased and such of the heirs as are of Lawful age and Joseph Eubanks the Guardian and Joseph Eubanks the Guardian and Joseph Eubanks the Guardian of the Infant heir proceeded to divide the several Negroes belonging to the Estate of the said deceased among the several Heirs after the choice of dower being made by the Widow of said deceased which division stands in manner and form following To wit To M^r. Sandridge as her Dower said Negroes agreed to by herself two Negroes Gist, David Lacey and Mamie a valuation One hundred and fifty pounds in Current Money a balance due her from said division of fifty pounds like Money to be hereafter accounted for To M^r. Robert Lacey a Negro Slave valuation One hundred and twenty pounds Current Money he to pay the sum of Twenty five pounds of like Money To William Sandridge a Negro Girl slave called Judith valuation Eighty pounds and to receive fifty pounds of like Money To Miss Patsy Sandridge two Negroes called To M^r. Alexander and Malinda valuation Twenty pounds Current Money and to receive five pounds of like Money To Miss Philadelphina Sandridge one Negro and slave called Thomas valuation One hundred pounds Current Money and subject to pay the sum of five pounds of like Money To Maria Sandridge one Negro Girl called Tom and to receive three valuation Twenty five pounds Current Money being his precise proportion of said Negroes exclusive of his interest of that portion of dower which had been assigned her when at her decease To James Sandridge two Negroes called a Woman slave and her child Robert valuation Twenty pounds Current Money the sum of five pounds of like Money paid due him of his portion of same Negroes To Larkin Sandridge a Negro Girl called Fannie valuation twenty pounds Current Money entitled to five pounds of like Money The foregoing contain the valuation and names of the several Negroes of James Sandridge deceased which have been presented before us also the several heirs of James Sandridge deceased which are entitled to distribution It will be understood that Robert Lacey claims as the Husband of Mary Lacey who was Mary Sandridge and one of the heirs of James Sandridge deceased In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands this ninth day of September A. D. 1809.
