possible Therefore being known to all whom it may concern
that I have made ordained constituted and appointed
and by their friends do make ordain constitute and
appoint my friend Miller A. Lee of the town and
State of Virginia my true and lawful attorney

89 for me and in my name with full power & authority to
sell and dispose of any property real personal or mixed
which I now have or which may hereafter become vested
in me, or to which I may now or hereafter claim title
Either in law or equity, and to make conveyances or con-
veyances thereof with such conditions or warranty as he
may think fit, except however Charles and Anne now
in his possession he is not to sell on any account, and
I do also empower my said Attorney to appoint any
Attorney or attorneys under him, and to every thing to
act as to him may appear proper. And to all
my said Attorney's legal acts I do hereby bind myself
and my heirs forever. And whereas the ways of
Providence, the uncertainty of life, and the many
hazards and dangers to which I may be exposed, I
be bound, Therefore be it also known that should I
depart this life before my return, it is my express will
and desire, and I do hereby declare that unto Charles
Anne I give the Negroes Charles and Anne above
named to her and her heirs and assigns forever, and
do hereby most solemnly forbid that for the want of
formality or technical expression in this particular
my intentions should be set aside or prevented from
taking its full operation, the balance of my Estate
after my debts are paid to pass by the law of descent
