State of Kentucky being well sick and weak of body but of perfect mind
and memory thank be to God for this cause calling for me the reality
of my body and knowing that this apprehension for all men once have
do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament that it being
principally and first of all I Give and recommend my soul
into the hands of almighty God that give it and my body
I leave unto the earth to be buried in decent Christian like manner
at the Discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General
Resurrection I shall receive the same again & the mighty power of God
and as touching such worldly estate as I have I have given by bequest
in the last Will and Testament of the same in this following
Manner and form First I Give unto my beloved son Charles
Biggers all my house hold furniture Stock Cattle and hogs and one
half plantation Mounts &c &c & as to the residue I Give to my wife
and at her Death or Marriage to be equally divided amongst
all my children to them in their proper shares my Will
and I Give that my daughter Anne who is now a bond slave shall
be sold and the Money arising from the sale thereof to be first
paid to Interest with what Money I have in the house for the
purpose of buying a plantation for the use of my wife during
her life & at her death or marriage to be
divided with the rest of my estate Last I do hereby appoint
my friends Samuel Sutter and Thomas Tucker my Executors
to this my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty first
Day of March One thousand Eight hundred and eleven in

in the penalty of fifteen hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs
and upon their motion Certificate is granted them for obtaining a
