I know all men by these presents that I William Marshall of the County of Marion and State of Kentucky being in a low state of health but in perfect mind memory and understanding but knowing the mortality of my body and that it is appointed eyes for all men to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament as touching such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me with I give Omit and Dispose of in the manner and form following the will first signed and bequeathed unto my wife Polly all and singular my lands and tenements during her natural life and after her death to be equally divided amongst my surviving Children I also leave unto my said wife Polly all my personal property freely to enjoy and at her disposal for the raising and maintaining the Children that is now under age and also to have the benefit of all bonds notes and debts due me since at her death what part of the personal left to be equally divided amongst the surviving Children I also nominate constitute and appoint my wife Polly my sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament renouncing all other last Testaments Legacies heretofore made.

In Witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this twentieth day of December in the year of our late Eighteenth hundred and ten.

The Court held for Marion County the 11th day of March 1811 this last Will and Testament of William Marshall deceased was produced in Court and proved by the Oaths of Peace James Lamb John Marshall and James Marshall Witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and sworn to by Polly Marshall the Executrix therein named who together with James Marshall John Marshall James Lamb and Richard Reed her securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand Dollars conditioned as the law directs and upon her widow's certificate to granted her for obtaining a probate thereon in due form.

I know all men by these presents that I John Marshall of the County of Fayette and State of Kentucky do hereby and oblige myself my heirs Executors and assigns to make or cause to be made unto Martin Winters of the aforesaid County a deed in fee simple or assign a deed for the quantity of forty acres of land lying and being in the County of Marion and on the waters of the Creek being the one half of the tract purchased from William Thomas
