& Basile Duke this 27th day of June 1798

This Depoⁿent being first sworn deposes and says
that in the month of June 1796 he in Company with
~~several~~ others among whom was Willis Edwards made
an improvement for the said Willis Edwards in the
low grounds of the Ohio River, that from the appearance
of the River hill and knoll whereon we now are he is indu-
ced to believe this is the place improved at
Quest by Thom. Forman. was it not customary to make
the initials of the Claimants name at the improvement
you made

Ans^r. It was but I cannot say that Willis Edwards
marked his name.

Quest. did Willis Edwards make any Considerable deaden-
ing

Ans^r. I do not recollect we were here but a short time & it
was late in the evening when we went away

Quest. do you find any appearance of a Cabbin or deaden-
ing at this place

Ans^r. I see no sign of a Cabbin nor any marked trees by an
ax or Tomahawk. there are a number of trees down and some
burnt in Considerable Degree

Quest. do not the improvements made the same year appear
very plain. Ans^r. Yes in the rich woods they appear very
plain. Quest. do you know of any improvements ^{made} in the
oak woods of that year which do not appear the lands
being unclear. Ans^r. I know of three which do not
appear ~~the same being made~~ at all. Quest. How do

you know you found the place where you improved at
as there was no ~~improvement~~ marks. Ans^r. I rather
supposed I did from the idea I have of the ground having
been frequently thro the woods. Quest. are you not to have
200 Dollars for your claim to Willis Edwards Improvement

Ans^r. I sold James Triplett's right (which was transferred to me)
to Mr. Nathaniel Ashby for 200 Dollars. Quest. What right
had James Triplett to this Land Ans^r. James Triplett pur-
chased a private survey of Tho. Billett in this bottom & being
doubtful ^{that} those private surveys were not good he employ
