ever and I do hereby Authorise and Impower and ap-
point Thomas Loundsdale and Simon Clinton both of

Young with of the Company Built a Cab-
bin and Devote some labor and work of
Young went up on the North side of the
North fork of Lick Creek on B. & B. Road
(off the said B. & B. Road) in the same place
where he now lives he made a few
holes which he said Deponant said of
Impression is founded and the Deponant
is informed the property located and this
Deponant further saith that he is not in any
way or way whatever to be held in the
way of the said claim whether established or
not and this Deponant further doth that he
intend to fight a prosecution by the use of
any other instrument made to him in the
Court a month of January of the one

109 above mentioned and this Deponant further saith
that Samuel Wells made an improvement on
the said North fork some small distance above
this Deponants Improvement which this Deponant
entertained some doubt of their lands interfering
and saith it was at the time of improving particularly
stipulated between the said Samuel Wells and
this Deponant that he the said Samuel Wells would
not interfere with the Deponants claim that as the
Lands was equally good that he the said Samuel
would turn his up the Creek in such a manner
as to avoid the Deponants claim and this de-
ponant further saith not Haydon Wells
