I give and bequeath to my son George Stan-
deford Seven hundred and fifty acres of
Land being part of the same Survey as
above mentioned Likewise give to my said
son George three years the Residue of my
servant Pompey time he pay unto Samuel
Hawkins Forty two pounds in order to
discharge a Debt due him the said Hawkins

23 I give and bequeath to my son Eliza-
Standeford Three Hundred and Fifty four
acres of Land being the Residue of the Land
above mentioned Likewise one Gray horse
and Likewise all my Carpenters ~~and~~ Joiners
Tools.

I give and bequeath to my son Aquilla
Standeford one hundred and Ten acres of
Land part of the Land I now live on the upper
end adjoining Hildrith and to be so laid off
as not injure the Residue of the survey my said
son Aquilla paying unto Samuel Hawkins Twenty
five Pounds to help to discharge a Debt due
to said Hawkins before he has a right to said
Land Likewise give to my said son Aquilla
one black horse.

I give and bequeath to my son John
Standeford the residue of my Land on Licking
the place I now live on and adjoining his
brother Aquilla to be the property of my said
son John at the death of his mother and her
widowhood.

I give and bequeath to my well beloved
wife Sarah Standeford after all my said

24 Debts are paid all the Residue of my personal property of every kind and Nature whatso ever to be at her own disposal and Like wise the Residue of the Land and plantation I now live on during her lifetime or Widow hood and at her death the personal property to be Equally divided among my children

Item, I desire at my Death that Joseph my servant may be a freeman

Item, Pompey my servant is to serve George Standiford three years. Said Three years to Commence the first day of January 1799 & after that he is a freeman

Item and Lastly I appoint George Standiford Executor to this my last will and Testament

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 10th day of January in the year of our Lord seventeen Hundred and Ninety nine signed sealed & Delivered by the above named Aquila Standiford as his last will

Condition as the Law requires and upon their motion Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in due form
