I Alexander Hamilton of the County of Monroe and
State of Kentucky do make oath and establish this for my
last will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all
others heretofore made in the first place it is my will and
desire that all my just debts shall be paid it is also my
will and desire that the tract of land on which I now live
granted to me by Signatus Mitchell for ninety eight acres ap-
pears by his deed to me together with all the stock of horses
and cattle sheep and hogs household furniture and farm
ing utensils of every description on or belonging to the Premises
shall be and remain the Property of my wife Elizabeth dur-
ing her life, and during her life she is to be at liberty to
dispose of any of the ^{part} of the Monable property in any manner
she may judge right and proper except a Black mare and
Cott Commonly called George Hamilton the Property of
George Hamilton which said mare and Cott it is my
will should be the absolutely the Property of the said George
Hamilton my son after the decease of my said wife Elizabeth
I will & bequeath to my said son George all the said premises
and tract of land granted to me for ninety eight acres
by the said Signatus Mitchell under the following terms
and Conditions to wit That he the said George shall when
Sisters Catharine Elizabeth Margaret Frances & Sumner
Hamilton Respectively arrive each of at the age of eight-
teen years or as soon as they each become Married give to
each of them at their respective marriages of their share
a good Cow and Calf It is my also my will and desire
that a full of about five acres more or less land

be and by my said son George on the Premises hereby devised to my wife Elizabeth during her life, should after my decease become the property of the said George with the liberty of clearing adjoining thereto but not without the consent of the said Elizabeth my wife during the life of my said wife Elizabeth and after her decease it is my will and desire that the family as above described should remain together and it is to be understood as part of this my last Will and Testament that unto my daughters Mary they are to be entitled to the rent of the Place on which I now live and the place now occupied by Hugh Fulton or rent meaning only the cleared ~~ground~~ land with Timber and firewood to support it and also meaning this as an obligation on my said son George and not to operate against my said wife at all. It is my will that I leave to my said wife Elizabeth and my said son George as before described not only the right to the land above described conveyed by the before named Squaw - Mitchell But also the land conveyed by A D Orr.

In Witness of this Instrument of writing as my last Will and Testament I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 29th day of May 1804 signed sealed and acknowledged before us
