 Act to Ascertain the Boundaries of Lands & for other
 purposes we have Proceeded to take the Deposition
 of Jacob Stucker to perpetuate the marking a
 tree by which an entry was made in the name of
 John Gallaway & Robert Johnson this Depoⁿant
 being first sworn Depose^th & saith that some in June
 or July One thousand seven hundred and Eighty three
 himself and James Twyman was on the Ohio & said
 Twyman marked a tree IS & IT 1783 as he then
 thought above limestone but since finds it to be
 below and above the mouth of Laurences Creek the
 tree being now down and some of the marks obliterated
 but such Remaining which induces him to believe it the same
 and further this Depoⁿant saith not
