I Bartholomew Fitzgerald knowing that I must Depart this life and being now weak in body but of sound memory Do make this and appoint this my last and Testament first I commit my soul to God who gave it and my body to be Decently buried and all my Lawful Debts to be Discharged Secondly I do will and bequeath to my Lawful and Loving wife Eleanor one third of my Estate real and personal During her life time and at her death to be at her Disposal among her Children but if after my Death my wife should Marry another man he shall have none of my Estate except one horse and saddle and one bed and clothing for said bed Thirdly I Give a Legacy to my son James Fitzgerald the sum of Ten shillings to be paid out of my Estate after my Death. Fourthly I Do give to my son Daniel Fitzgerald the sum of Five shillings to be paid out of my Estate. Fifthly I Do give and bequeath all the remaining Part of my Estate both real and personal to be equally divided Between my sons John Benjamin, David, Moses and Samuel and my two Daughters Polly and Mary and moreover as all my Children have now a horse each one but my Daughter Mary I Do give her a Young bay mare with four white feet. Sixthly I Do set my two black women free at the age of thirty years and then offering that they may have During their servitude as to be free at the age of thirty and seventhly I Do reserve my Dwelling house for my Wife to Live in her lifetime and Lastly I Do appoint James Henry Benjamin Fitzgerald and Eleanor my wife to be my Executors of my Estate In Witness of all Whereunto set my hand and seal this thirty first day of March in the year of our Lord 1810

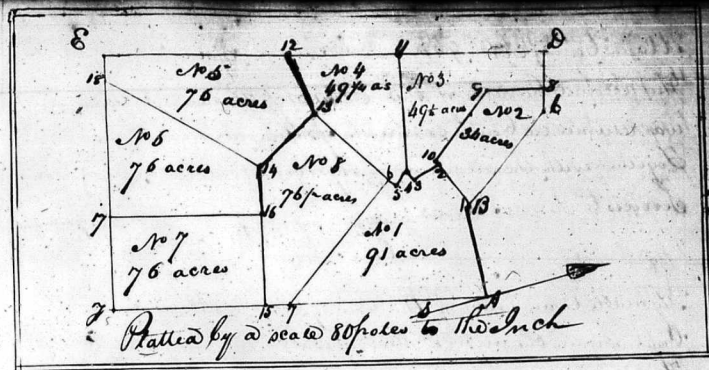
